
Нил прорезает с юга на север огромную пустыню Сахару. Именно на узкой - шириной не больше 15 километров сжатой с обеих сторон пустыней, полосе плодородной земли вдоль берегов реки, в V тысячелетии до н. э. и сформировался

Для земледелия важны орошение и удобрение почвы. и Нил обе эти вещи делал за людей. Каждый год в результате дождей, которые обильно проливались далеко на юге, в глубинах Афонки, в июле начинался раздив реки. Паволок напитывал землю влагой на долгие месяцы вперёд. Когда же вода отступала и Нил возвращался в свои берега, он оставлял египтенам ещё один бесценный подарок - ил. отличное удобрение для полей.


Нил «сформировал» и древнеегипетский календарь. Год начинался с разливом реки - с середины июля, и делился на три сезона, по четыре несяца каждый: время половодыя, время всходов, время засухи. (НИА) и (ЕГИПЕТ) - греческие названия. Египетские названия Нила - ХАПИ или ИТЕРУ («река»).

Та-Кемет - (ЧЁРНАЯ ЗЕМАЯ) (плодородная, цвета ила). в противоположность «Красной земле» - безжизненной, снертоносной пустыне.

Нил не только кормил египтян, но также одевал и снабжал «бунагой»: на полях выращивали лён, по берегам реки собирали ПАПИРУС – растение, из которого делали писчий материал для всего Средиземноморья. Стебли папируса разрезали на продольные полосы, которые плотно укладывали друг на друга крест-накрест и высушивали. Потом листы склеивались между собой и сворачивались в свитки (а не сшивались в книги, как сегодня). Если бы не папирус, не на чем было бы писать не только египтянам, но даже грекам и римлянам. А ещё Нил соревнуется с Аназонкой за звание самой длинной реки на Земле.
