Sometimes good, sometimes bad, these specters are often very mischievous! To do this, he decides to go to a temple, inhabited by yōkai, and spend the night there.

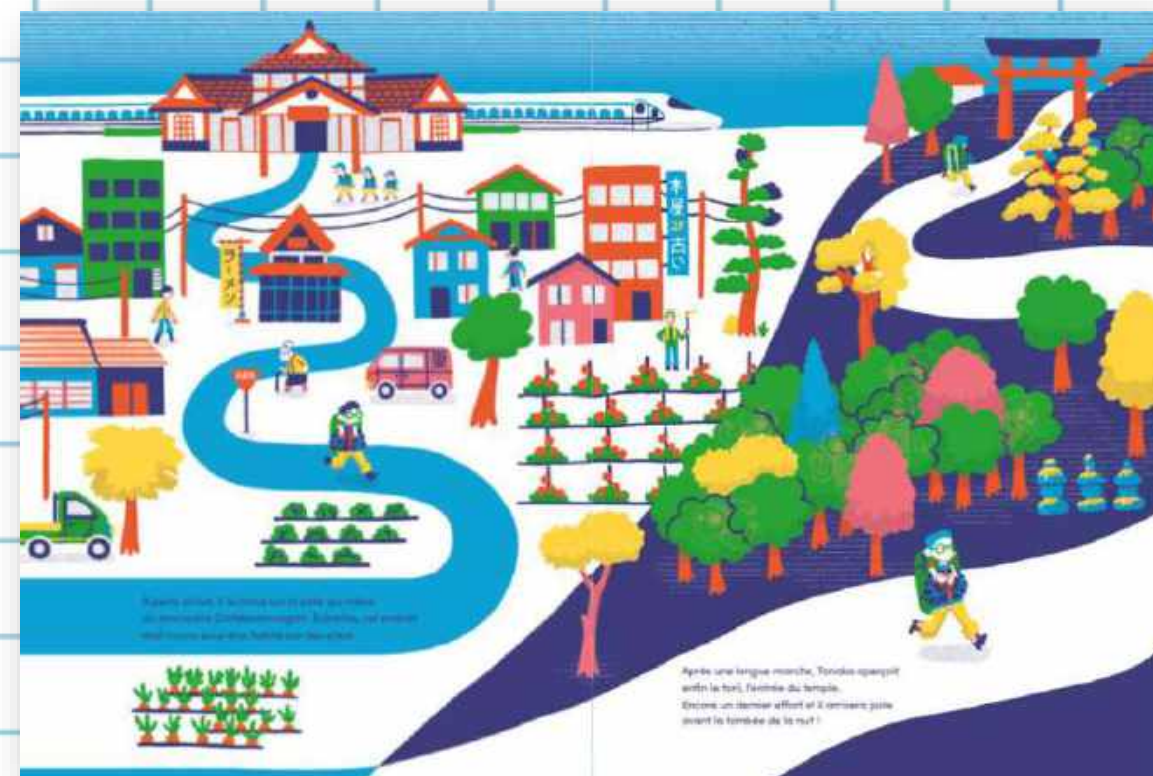
