## **Reminiscent of Brazil's black history**

Kieza is a story about black people who are enslaved and brought from Africa to work on farms in Brazil. With the help of a brave young slave woman, descendant from an African queen, they manage to band together and organize an escape.

In this story, they build a Quilombo, a settlement and new home, which is soon destroyed by the Brazilian state authorities.

But even with a failed project, Kieza and her partner Manoel are still full of strength and pride and proclaim: "Long live our ancestors! Long live the black people!".

The author Marcos Cajé is passionate about exploring the experiences of Black people. For his children's books celebrating Black culture in Brazil, he coined the term "Afrofantastic Literature."

The book's illustrator, Ógbá, is a graffiti artist whose work highlights Black ancestry and everyday life in São Paulo. His striking black-and-white illustrations perfectly complement Marcos Cajé's poetic storytelling.






The end of the text closes the circle of the temporary separation and offers security to the children and the parents.

To top it off, with illegal gold mining, prospectors using mercury are polluting the water severely.

The Pink dolphin, Jaguar, Blue Macaw, Caiman, Tamanduá, Golden Lion Tamarin and their friends are writing messages to each other, worrying about the state of the forest and searching for their friends, the Golden Toad, the Long-Tailed Hopping Mouse and the Spix's Macaw. The only problem is that all these species are in extinction or at least extinct in the wild.

This beautiful picture book ignites young readers' curiosity about the animals from the Amazon and what we can do to save them.
