




In twenty luminous plates, the Italian duo composed of Guia Risari and Andrea Calisi invites us on a gentle, poetic journey, through highly mastered illustrations to immerse ourselves in a magnificent ode to contemplation.



Born in 1968, **Andrea Calisi** is an Italian illustrator. While he has produced numerous covers for prestigious Italian publishing houses, he also worked for several years in a kindergarten and illustrated several children's books. His work has been exhibited several times in Europe and Japan. He lives in Rome and *Sentiers* is his very first book to be published in French.



Herbarium - Emily Dickinson's prairie

What if Emily Dickinson's very first poems had been her flowers and plants? Little by little, the young Emily patiently collects and preserves violets, jasmine and forget-me-nots between the pages of her books, to be able to express her secrets – like the powerful attachment she feels for Abby, her new classmate. Laura Ulonati's finely-crafted text is interspersed with magnificent full-page colored pencil illustrations by Nathalie Novi, featuring sensual stems and petals in brilliant hues. With Emily, this new duo is putting themselves at the vertiginous height of children's emotions, invite young and older readers alike to take an inner journey through an infinitely poetic universe, as gentle as it is sweet.

At the end of the book, on more than twenty blank pages, readers can express themselves by starting their own herbarium, following in Emily's, Laura's and Nathalie's footsteps.







Born in Italy, **Laura Ulonati** grew up and studied in France. She is the author of three novels: *Une histoire italienne* (Gallimard, 2019; Prix Henri de Régnier de l'Académie française 2020, finalist for the Prix du Premier Roman 2019), *Dans tout le bleu* (Actes Sud, 2021) and *Double V* (Actes Sud, 2023). *Herbarium* is her very first text written for children.



After studying intaglio engraving at the Beaux-Arts in Paris, Nathalie Novi published her first children's book. Fête foraine, with Éditions Nathan in 1997. Since then, she has continued to work on children's themes through a large number of award-winning books. Literature and creativity are an integral part of her inspiration, as in her books Le Musée imaginaire de Jane Austen (Albin Michel. 2017), or Mrs Dalloway et Alice au pays des merveilles (Tibert, 2018 and 2024). She also creates pictorial performances, accompanied by musicians, around texts read by an actor.






Alf and Orel








Only the Ground

Sand, soil, tarmac, concrete, grass or even pebbles... The ground is diverse, hilly, flat or uneven, but always a support for the fauna, flora and humans that inhabit the Earth. Re-establishing its vital nature, this long poem in the form of haikus reminds us that soil is the memory of life, and how crucial it is to preserve it, to take care of it, to preserve our world and a livable future. Enhanced by Maya Mihindou's colourful and evocative drawings, this dreamy, joyful and educational text invites children to become more aware of the world they live in, whether they live in the city or the countryside, and encourages them to learn about the fight against soil erosion and the preservation of the environment.






Davide Cali was born in 1972. He began his career as a comics illustrator and writer, before writing books for children. His first titles were published in Italy, before being released in France.

His book À chaque pied sa chaussure (2018), illustrated by Cecilia Campironi, was published by Éditions Cambourakis. Many of his illustrated picture books have been adapted for the theatre in France, Italy, Belgium and Japan. He has written more than 60 books, translated in over 30 countries, under the pseudonym Taro Miyazawa.

Paolo Domeniconi is an Italian illustrator who lives near Bologna. After working in advertising in the 1990s, he began illustrating children's books, starting with classics by Charles Perrault, the Grimm Brothers, or *The Three Little Pigs*. He has worked with lots of publishers around the world, such as Houghton Mifflin, Harcourt and Mondadori. In France, he illustrated *La Fleur perdue du chaman de K.*, published by L'École des loisirs (2021).

Following the international success of Au 10 rue des Jardins, Felicita Sala is back with a new book of recipes for kids, based on easy-to-grow fruit and vegetables, whether in the city or countryside! Twelve sweet or savoury dishes for each month... In the kitchen or the garden, seasonality is key! Each double page includes a large illustration of a character, showing a variety of places and different techniques for growing delicious food, and a recipe page, presented in a very visual way. The picture book ends with a big picnic scene and six non-fiction pages, with tips and ideas for planting all kinds of fruit and veg. A Year at Flowerville is a cookbook, a mini guide to gardening, and a picture book rolled into one, celebrating the joys of coming together and sharing "edible marvels", that are so much fun to grow.

He designed several public gardens such as the Parc André Citroën and the Jardin du Quai Branly in Paris, the Jardins du Roi in Blois, the Jardins Valloires in the Somme and the Parc Henri Matisse in Lille.



Poetic and documented texts on fruits, vegetables and gardens across continents echo our concerns and the growing interest for issues related to food and alternative practices of farming.








The No-No Bison

The No-No bison was born in autumn when the leaves are yellow, orange and brown. But he's not like the other little bison. He's so hairy that you can only see his little round eyes, and no mouth or nose. His parents try to think of a name - Bisonson, Bisonou, Bisou... But he just looks at them, as though to say, "no no"! So, everyone starts calling him the No-No bison. And as he gets bigger, they continue to think that the look in his eye means "no". No to pinecones, no to chestnuts, no to the grass under the snow, no to games... But would he still say "no" to everything if he knew how to talk? An unexpected encounter with a little lobster - and its pincers! - will soon set the record straight!

He injures himself badly, which makes him look ugly, and feel very sad. How can he get better and become the bear with beautiful fur like before? Kaori, a little fairy from the village sees blood flowing down the river. Feeling brave, she sets off to find Kintsugi the bear, to heal his wounds. The bear in this story is named after Kintsugi, the Japanese art form of repairing broken pottery with lacquer dusted with powdered gold. Superbly illustrated, this picture book invites readers to help one another, but also to take care of living beings and things, repair and love them with their history and imperfections.

Victoire De Changy was born in 1988 in Brussels, where she still lives and works in poetry. She has published two novels with Éditions Autrement.







The Getaway



A pretty nursery rhyme-like text is added to each illustration, gradually weaving a link between them and telling us a story about life in the garden. When it rains, where can the hedgehog hide? A lovely little book to get autumn off to a good start.





The Other Side of the Mountain

A little girl and her sister live near the mountains. Every year, they go hiking with their parents. But this year is different. They're more experienced now and decide to go by themselves, with their aunt Jeanette's map from 1978. So, they set off on a seven-day walk through the mountains towards Chamroux. They see marmots along the way and soon realise that they underestimated the summer temperatures, finishing their first night in a mountain refuge. This adventure at a child's level showcases beautiful landscapes with bold colours, characteristic of Géraldine Alibeu's sketches. The full page illustrations, with no words. reveal the subtleties and nuances of a natural environment that is constantly changing, and tell the story of two daring sisters, determined to complete their hike and immerse themselves into the mountain fauna and flora. The Other Side of the Mountain subtly reflects on the concepts of adventure (that you can experience just a few kilometres from home) and freedom, as well explores

the relationship between humans and

nature.



Géraldine Alibeu spent every Wednesday as a child making things out of cardboard and sticky-back oilcloth. In primary school, she created a comic about her teacher. A few years later, she joined Claude Lapointe's illustration workshop at the Arts Décoratifs de Strasbourg (now HEAR) and graduated in 2001. She now illustrates children's books and magazines and writes her own picture books. She has also experimented with animated film and has been developing her work in ceramics and textile illustration for several years.





The Refuge

We follow a resourceful little boy: he is astute and enthusiastic, and does not hesitate to ask each person he meets something, an object, a piece of advice. As a result, a shelter is built; a refuge as well as a mirror of the diversity of individuals who helped him to construct it. A soft, colourful and generous picture book, a beautiful thought on welcoming and altruism.

Géraldine Alibeu, highly interested in the cruelly relevant issue of refugees, refers to this subject with subtlety and tenderness.

Midnight, the Cat of the Lost Woods

A little boy called Noël lives on the edge of the lost woods with his parents.

Noël knows the woods a bit, but he does not know what lies on the other side. He has never crossed through them before. His parents say there is nothing there. One night, Noël meets a cat, as black as the night, just outside the woods. After naming him Midnight, Noël asks: "Midnight, have you ever crossed through the lost woods?"

Midnight is a very wise and mysterious cat, who pushes Noël to be curious, ask questions, and finally explore the lost woods for himself. This night-time story, full of enigmas and shadows, invites the young reader to think about places, exploring the world around them, and the power of naming things to know and better understand them.

A gentle initiation story, richly illustrated in painting, immersing the reader into the lush, colourful woods, teeming with life.





Hélène Gaudy was born in Paris in 1979. Graduated in visual arts, she explores how text and pictures interact to create stories. After a first novel, Vues sur la mer (selected for Medicis Prize in 2006), she is involved in several editorial projects, and is a member of Inculte, collective of french writers. She has written four novels so far (the latest *Un monde sans rivages*, is selected for the 2019 Goncourt Prize), and several children books, among which two at Éditions Cambourakis – *Mon tout petit pays*, with Anne Beauchard, and *Je veux enlever la nuit*, with Simone Real





Born in 1979 in Amiens, **Anne Beauchard** studied at the École Supérieure des Arts Décoratifs (applied arts school) in Strasbourg. Mon tout petit pays is the first children's picture book she has illustrated. She lives and works in Paris.






Born in Pennsylvania in 1874, Gertrude Stein moved to France with her brother Leo in 1903. Both had a keen eye for art and became amongst the greatest patrons on the Parisian scene. Gertrude differentiated herself from her brother with a predilection for artistic radicalism, particularly Cubism. Her relationship with Alice B. Toklas marked a definite break from her brother. The gallery they ran together in their apartment on rue de Fleurus became a rendezvous for painters (Picasso, Matisse, Derain...). She also wrote a great deal, trying her hand at different genres, reinventing them in her own way with repetitions and groups of clauses that twisted the grammar. She died in Paris in 1946.

Alice Lorenzi lives and works in Liège, Belgium. She contributes to a number of anthologies and fanzines (Nos restes, Grandpapier, Mycose...) and published Les Heures de verre with La Cinquième Couche.






NICOLAS DE CRÉCY
