Now the four friends are about to knock on Bear's door! A flash of lightning shows them just in time.

As they pass each animal's home again, we discover where all the strange noises came from: frrrfrrrfrrr — just a branch, clack-clack — a window shutter, glug-glug — the gutter dripping. Now they are all safe and sound at Mouse's house. But who's knocking at the door? It is Bear... Yes, even he is afraid of the storm — and needs some friends tonight.

This fun wild chase is full of little chills and has an unexpected twist. The lively text is full of gurgles and snaps, bringing the story to life. Charming animals and vibrant illustrations playfully interact with the onomatopoeia in the text.

About the author: Céline Claire lives in Moselle. Formerly a teacher, she has been fully devoted to writing for children since 2006. Her work is published by Oskar Jeunesse and Le Rouergue. With L'Élan vert, she has published *The Caribou Hunt* and *A Secret Mission for Christmas*.
