



He holds writing courses and has collaborated with various educational institutions, such as the MiMaster of Illustrazione Editoriale in Milan, Ars in Fabula in Macerata and the IED in Turin Sara Arosio was born and raised in a foggy town near Milan; she studied history, visual culture and painting, and in 2022 she attended the MiMaster of ilustration. Her work has appeared in several magazines, and in 2023 she illustrated the album Un giorno tutto questo sarà tuo (Science Express), written by Davide Calì, an ecologically themed book about the impact of our waste.

Elena Levi Serge Bloch *History of NO*

«NO» is one of the first words to enter - often in a way that is not too welcome - in everyone's life. One of the first things children learn and hear from adults. We are talking about NO. A word so short but so frequent that it is certainly useful to know more about it. How did the NO come about? What is it used for? It has been known to be used all over the world for a long time, but who, for example, imagined that in China it has the shape of a dragon, in Africa of a crocodile, and in India even the frightening shape of a snake's head and ten arms? Besides, NOs are by no means all the same. There are the annoying ones, the boring ones and the sad ones, but also the important ones (History is full of examples), the just ones (NO to war! NO to pollution!) and, conversely, the unjust ones (NO to freedom, NO to equality), those that have a good reason for being said and those that actually have no reason at all... Page after page, a journey through the history of this little-big word to figure out how to untangle the different NOs and learn, in the end, to say it for the right reason. And at that point, not even the adults will have anything to object to!

How did the NO come about? And most of all, what is it for? A picture books that will be impossible to say NO to, signed by one of France's greatest illustrators



He is an illustrator of successful series and picture books translated worldwide and edits graphic projects for major kid magazines.





Sergio Olivotti The Music Genius





Nominated for the Premio Strega Ragazzi 2022, he received a special mention at the Premio Rodari 2021, won the best digital illustrations award at Lucca Junior 2018, and the best analog illustrations award at the Annual Authors of Illustrations 2018. He has been selected at several editions of the Bolivian, Polish, Mexican, and Russian poster biennials (Golden Bee) and at PosterForTomorrow. He conceived the Italian Poster Biennial in 2014. For 20 years he has been teaching Graphic Design in Italian high schools.
