



The young woman standing away from the village in the shade seems pensive; haunted by a desire to leave and see the world beyond the surrounding woods and mountains, she broods. Fear keeps the villagers from exploring the woods and becoming part of the wilderness: fear of Emkla, a vengeful entity whose laws govern relations between humans and non-humans, among other things.

When a law is broken, a thousand plagues fall upon the little village. Rather than live as a rebel in a home that has become a nightmare, the young woman decides to leave it all behind and go far, far away, beyond the big rocks, in search of the truth.

Dark, amoral, **Emkla** is breathless adventure that explores the relationship between humans and nature and interrogates traditions and ideologies that confine and constrain instead of freeing and enlightening us.

Adam's versatility is well-known; in **Emkla**, she has produced her finest pages, watercolors that capture nature's cruel beauty and the ephemeral folly of being human.







The owner, Nabil, lets them set up their little studio, even encouraging them sometimes, giving them exercises like an impromptu teacher. Not that Nabil is your usual bookstore owner. He fell into it by accident, and has very definite ideas and principles when it comes to comics—for instance, refusing to stock **Tintin...**

The scene: a small, unnamed city. The time: summer, 1994. Slowly but surely, a more demanding movement is growing in the world of comics. What with one teen dreaming of a comics career, another being an enlightened dilettante and gifted artist, ambitions but also confessions are making themselves apparent in conversations even as destinies risk drifting far apart.

Un monde en pleine mutation is a sincere love letter to comics, the DIY and fanzine scenes, and also a ("graphic") coming-of-age novel where form and content come together in a playful, joyful way.






Eye Contact

A genius. That's what he thinks when he beholds his own drawings.

His routine is almost that of a hunter: watching, tracking, then capturing a scene or person and sketching them quickly from life, without anyone noticing. And in order to do so, he must, above all, never meet his subject's gaze, avoid all eye contact.

One day, this routine breaks down, for the eternal observer encounters someone cleverer than he is; when an unpredictable young woman spots and escapes him, the hunter becomes the hunted.

Eye Contact is a thriller without a crime, a tail job with no detective, a chase whose target is always disappearing from view, and the only mystery is that of another person. **Eye Contact** is also a declaration of love for drawing. Beuret evokes the loneliness of the one who looks on and the obsessive aspect that artistic practice can assume. The result is an intimate odyssey full of charm and humor.



In a world full of legless, armless, or torso-less humans, Gus and his three heads are an exception, even an anomaly. A modern-day slave toiling in a factory at an untenable pace, the liquor Gus downs only makes him lose time instead of yielding answers in his search for meaning and self.

A shallow therapist, a blaming mother, and a well-kept family secret—Gus, ever conflicted, doesn't know what to hang on to.

The day production speeds ramp up even more on the assembly line, this three-headed man cracks and tosses in his apron in a trendsetting act. His explosive behavior makes him the primary suspect when the big factory is sabotaged...

Armed with an expert sense of the absurd, Deville portrays a fantastical world that mirrors our own through a glass darkly, overproducing and underproviding.


And yet **Le Grand Je** is far from cynical or despairing, and even comes across as a beautiful ode to disobedience and an invitation to conscientious objection.



Though the virus may pose a challenge, it doesn't keep a certain community from moving forward: as its members attempt to organize as horizontally as possible, as per their principles and ethics, despite vast differences among them, despite tensions, dissension, and misunderstandings.

La Macchia's interested in certain kinds of social mechanisms: those that rule groups and define the act of living together. In **Naturellement**, he seems to be specifically probing ideology's reach but especially its limits, and how best to come to terms with small betrayals and juggle paradoxes.

Also explored is the relationship between humans and nature: an ambivalent, ambiguous relationship informed at times by fantasy and at others by amoral reality.



Finding out you have a father when you're 39 is a strange experience. After a brief phase of denial, Claire faces facts and, her stomach in knots, decides to go meet this stranger. Although he is at death's door, and everything's topsy-turvy, life goes on for her: children, work, friends...

L'Élephant is full of sensitivity and modesty, and devoid of all pathos. Pralong navigates perilous waters with effortless lightness of touch. Through her instantly recognizable art, and a writerly sensibility as clever as it is inventive and tinged with humor, she turns what might have been a leaden drama into a profound moment of humanity.

First published in 2007 and out of print for almost fifteen years, this winner of Geneva's Prix Töpffer and the Prix Révélation for new talent at the Angoulême International Comics Festival is available once more at last.

The tape recorder kicks off at the old lady's house to preserve and above all reconstruct an understandably rare interview amidst a jumble of objects that make the place look like a cabinet of curiosities. Once an amateur archeologist, she seems interested in the past-what remains, but also what has disappeared and been overlooked. From memories to ramblings, evocations to digressions, the conversation makes its way past vanished animals and Egyptian gods, from the fictional explorer Gulliver to sculptor Jean-Joseph Carriès, and many other things besides.

The premise of **L'Obliée** stirs up all sorts of exciting questions: how to properly interpret vestiges of the past? Is memory the key to a certain kind of immortality? And what of all those who have been... forgotten?



A story told with Wojciechowski's unique style, using the architects' software AutoCAD to draw machines, buildings, and urban landscapes.



Not until 1983 do they see each other at a dinner thrown by Kim Jong-il.

A great fan of film, Kim Jong-il forced them to make movies for him, including the kaiju classic **Pulgasari** (1985). Choi and Shin must make the media believe they're voluntarily working for the regime. Slowly, their love blossoms once more.

At the Vienna Film Festival in 1986, they manage to escape after a daring car chase, and take refuge in the American embassy, where they are given asylum.



Inspired by the memories of the author's father, who spent part of his childhood as a contract child, **Starkes Ding** is a personal history that uncovers the harsh reality of farm life in Switzerland in the 1950s, but also the deep and significant bonds that the main character manages to build despite his hardships.





After the Hungarian Revolution of 1956, Schwarzbauer's grandmother emigrated to Austria and his sister to Canada, where her son started a family with an Anishinabek woman.

Schwarzbauer sets out to tell this complicated story made up of wanderings and strayings, different cultures and prejudices.

This graphic novel works on two narrative levels: one presents the memories of the three main characters, whom Schwarzbauer interviewed about their experiences fleeing Hungary, their lives there and in Canada. The second level tells of Schwarzbauer's own journey to Canada to reconstruct a family biography. Both levels stand out in their formal aspect: Schwarzbauer's research and travels are done in India ink, while the interview episodes are interwoven, words and pictures separated in space. Such distinctions help highlight temporal and geographical distance but also differences between the lived, the recounted (oral history), the overheard, and the imagined. A complex and striking graphic debut.



A woman with no eyes is drawing the outline of an eye in ink. Before she has time to draw another, a mischievous ape swipes her inkwell and downs the contents. She plunges headlong into a quest for ink, and independence. She hurts herself, burns herself, bleeds, totters, and limps... but nothing will stop her from getting the precious ink! The urgency of desire drives the character to take charge of her own destiny and restore her bodily integrity.

Sommer was inspired by the legend of the Buddhist monk Daruma, who cut shot his own eyelids to meditate better, and the lucky charms that bear his name. These papier-mâché charms have two empty spots where the eyes should be: to make a wish, draw the left eye first, and when the wish has been granted, paint the right eye, and then burn the Daruma.

In this book stripped of embellishment and dialogue and told in a hard-hitting graphic style with precise Japanese paper cutouts, Sommer delivers a disturbing tale, part modern legend and part manifesto for self-determination.









They have never felt any doubts about this decision until they meet their new roommate Lisa who, despite the impression she gives off as a confident, good-looking woman, thinks her own breasts could use some minor enhancing. Between Emil's excision and Lisa's augmentation, who is most deserving of surgery?

Through this very immediate experience, Peer Jongeling spins a half-fictional, half-autobiographical comic about the journey that is transitioning, as well as the possibilities of detransitioning and a fresh start. Structured as a series of intimate reflections on gender dysphoria, but also discourses well aware of the realities lived by members of the LGBTQI+ community, **Emil-ia** is a story of uncertainty, choices, dreams, and sensitivity.

The stripped-down layouts, the evocation, symbolic, and ironic power of this young German creator softens the lines of its harsh narration.


Bianca has been living with her aunt Clémentine and her cousin Julien ever since her parents suddenly vanished into thin air.





That's the motto of Clocki, the famous big-eyed clock who chimes snacktime for millions of kids gathered round the TV after school.



Drawings drip, settings melt, and perspectives begin to distort like a burnt film reel in a projector, turning the amusement park dream into an eerie, grotesque nightmare.







Simon puts man-hating Simone Michel center stage to explore female authority and show how the exercise of power can drive a rebellious woman to excess and insanity.





"The Marylene Tales" [The tales of Barbarann] are Anne Simon's great saga.

Since 2005, she has developed a portfolio of atypical characters like Henry The Horse and Boris the potato child, or Gousse & Gigot, and by mixing literature and pop culture, she develops a unique mythology.

This vast epic follows the uncertain fate of the kingdom of Marylene through multiple eras as it is buffeted by the whims of the ruling classes. Once ruled by the tyrant Von Krantz, the kingdom reaches its apogee under the Aglaia, the all-powerful queen who nonetheless can't help but give her sone Boris everything he demands. Oscillating between dictatorship, self-rule, and savage capitalist regimes, the people of Marylene live in a wild and chaotic universe.




Bottleneck refers to a difficult passage through a narrow or impeded section, and a stage in a hindered process.






In 2019, Loïc Froissart spent a year working in a primary school, an immersive experience that left him with an appreciation for the unique feel of the place.

Aujourd'hui is Froissart's comic debut.




