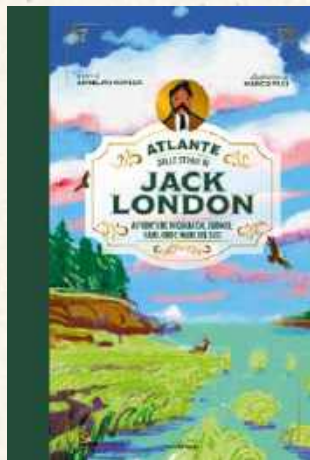
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ABOUT US

ANSELMO ROVEDA (1972), journalist, literary critic and writer lives in Genoa in a house facing the harbour.

For over ten years he has worked as an educator, administrator and coordinator of education in social services for the prevention of children distress. Since 2008 is editor-in-chief of "Andersen", the most important Italian children's books magazine. Author of children's books, fiction and poems, he is professor of Creative Writing in Urbino and holds workshops at the University for Foreigners in Perugia.

MARCO PACI (1975), lives and works in Bologna. Since 1997 he collaborates with designers, publishers and institutions in visual communication. He is one of the founders of the Cultural Association 'Murmure', in the field of education. He organizes workshops and performances for children and adults on illustrations and theatre. He published illustrated books with the most important Italian publishers including Jaca Book, EDT Giralangolo and Sinnos.

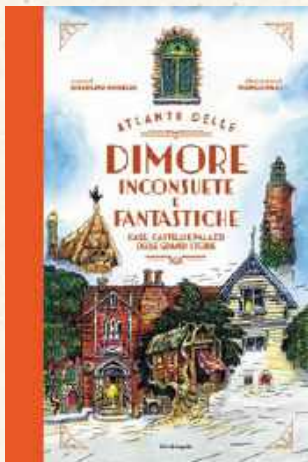
A LITERARY ATLAS OF MONSTERS AND FRIGHTS

After having taken young readers and bibliophiles of all ages on a rocket to the moon in the company of Jules Verne, from Siberia to China following Captain Salgari, to the enchanted moors with *Prezzemolina* and to Treasure Island with Jim, now we've hidden in the shadows behind the door and are ready to frighten them.

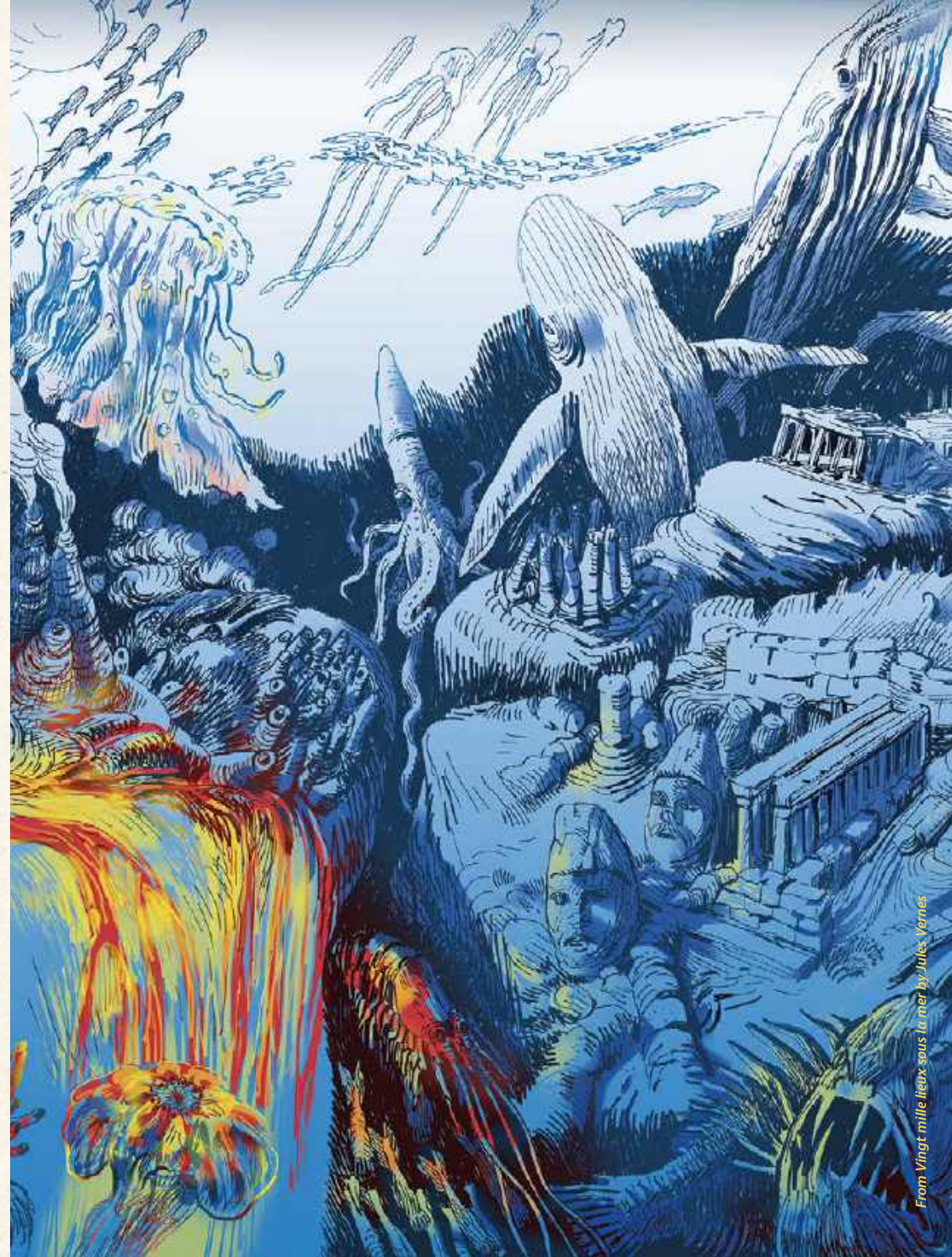

A LITERARY ATLAS OF EXTRAORDINARY JOURNEYS and of the unusual means of transport used to complete them

A round-the-world trip, a real one, is what you'll find in these pages. Here is the third volume of the series of Illustrated Literary Atlases edited by Anselmo Roveda, which follows on from the Salgari Atlas and the Atlas of Imagined Places. It is dedicated to one of the most prolific and imaginative authors ever: Jules Verne. Two centuries of enthusiastic readers have followed this author to the most remote corners of the globe (and above it and in its bowels, to tell the truth), and even today, one hundred and fifty years from the first publications, the magic of those stories is still alive and kicking. Anselmo Roveda and Marco Paci become the ambassadors of that magic



spell, returning to the places described in the novels and stories of the "Voyages Extraordinaires" cycle, which has over sixty works published between 1863 and 1919 (some of which were posthumous, edited by his son, Michel Verne). With them we fly



over Africa in an aerostatic balloon, we follow an expedition into the bowels of the Earth, to Greenland on the trail of Captain Hatteras, to nineteenth-Century Peking. And not just that!

A great enthusiast of science and technology, Verne gave his characters so many exceptional, intriguing, innovative means of transport both by land and by sea: submarines and brigantines, rockets and hot-air balloons have space and life in these pages thanks to Marco Paci's lovely illustrations. Just like the previous Atlases, this one too is ready to light the fuse of fabulous passions, from reading to fantastic journeys, in new generations of bibliophiles of all ages.

A LITERARY ATLAS OF ADVENTURES BY SEA AND LAND with extracts chosen from the literary works of Emilio Salgari

Malaysia, India, Sudan, The Far West, the Rocky Mountains, the North Pole, Bermuda, the Amazon, Russia, Black Africa, Europe and the Mediterranean, the Pacific Ocean, China, Australia...A large format illustrated album with tables divided by continents and detailed information on specific areas. Each table is accompanied by brief quotations taken from the works of Emilio Salgari, which describe the countryside, culture, architecture, costumes, and peoples of that part of the world.



Born in Verona in 1862, Emilio Salgari was an Italian writer of adventure and science fiction stories for readers of all ages. He wrote more than two hundred short stories and novels, many of which are considered classics. He is the father of the Italian popular culture and of the Spaghetti Western. His pirate stories are full of exotic characters, his heroes come from a wide variety of cultures. Salgari claimed he travelled throughout America where he met Buffalo Bill; he said he explored the Sudan, lived at the Mahdi's court, loved Indian princesses, sailed among the many islands of the Far East... Except that very little of it was true. He travelled very little and mainly drew his stories from encyclopaedias, maps and magazines read in libraries. His work has been translated in more than 25 countries and, besides Italy, it is very popular in the Spanish-speaking world. The Atlas helps us to understand how he managed to create imaginary worlds in real contexts even though he had never travelled, and reveals how he did his research on the areas of the worlds where he set his books, without leaving his house and without the Internet, his elements of science fiction, his keenest readers (among whom were Che Guevara, Isabel Allende, Umberto Eco).

THE SECRET LIFE OF JOS PHINE BAKER

Dangerous, subversive, intelligent, beautiful: Josephine Baker was all of these things at once.

Born in conditions of extreme poverty in Saint Louis in 1906, within two decades she became "the most sensational woman ever seen" (words by Ernest Hemingway). She enchanted two continents with her charm and her skills as a singer and dancer, but few still know that that magnetism and those chameleonic abilities were not only useful to her on the stage of the Folies Berg re: Miss Baker was a spy and a partisan, awarded the L gion d'honneur at the end of the Second World War. She was a mysterious and multi-faceted woman; she was considered too beautiful to be intelligent. In fact, she was so intelligent and she had an incredible potential and courage. She was able to take advantage of those same prejudices. An illustrated book that celebrates the first black diva in history and does so by putting her splendid ostrich boas under the spotlight, as well as her daring and courageous exploits in wartime.

L LIE LESAGE is a very talented young French-Canadian illustrator from Montreal. She lived in Italy for eight years, moving between different cities including Venice and Urbino where she obtained her Master's degree in Communication, Design and Publishing at ISIA. She worked on contemporary art for the Guggenheim Foundation and the Venice Biennale.

In these books, the story and the pictures are represented by pictograms, ideograms that can be read in an immediate, global way, a versatile form of communication more effective than words that crosses the barriers of individual languages and can be understood everywhere and by everybody. Pictograms are a powerful tool for the cognitive system; their descriptive nature provides high quality pictorial representation, which facilitates memorization.

Recognizing an image is easier than reading text. Pictograms have the potential to be interpreted more accurately and more quickly than words. The effectiveness of these pictograms, relies on characteristics such as colour, shape, symbols and visual complexity. Natalini adapted them taking into account their pragmatism, syntax and semantics to make them more reader-friendly and in order to facilitate the elaboration of the story.

This strengthens the powers of observation in children: alone or in groups, they use their own words to describe/narrate what they see. Teachers (from kindergarten on) can actively involve all the children who have not yet acquired the skill of reading, but also children who speak different languages, children



or adults with limited linguistic ability or visual problems, encouraging them to become storytellers. Pre-school age little boys and girls can not only get into the story without help, but they are encouraged to look at the pictures and graphic signs, codes for reading which can be freely interpreted and which are really stimulating for little readers.

TOPSY TURVY

In the kingdom of Castel Cipolla – Onion Caste – lives a knight princess, who is constantly issuing new decrees as if to mark the passing of the day. In fact, the princess is always proclaiming new laws which the people must obey instantly. Rules like "From now on horses can ride their knights! I order people to wear trousers on their heads! Everybody do handstands!" are applied at the drop of a hat, so the subjects suddenly find themselves walking with their hands on the ground and their legs in the air. What seems uncomfortable at first quickly becomes an opportunity. There are some creative solutions: some find a way to take their dog for a walk, others play hide and seek, yet others use balloons so they don't strain their wrists.

One day, at the gates of the kingdom some enemy soldiers arrive, armed with the worst intentions. And that is the moment when the knight princess' orders come in handy for the whole kingdom of Castel Cipolla, by scaring the terrorized adversaries away.

MR LUCKYGUY

Mr. LuckyGuy has so many things: an enormous house surrounded by an estate with even a zoo, he has a fleet of aeroplanes and a submarine and he goes out every morning in his bright red sports car. One windy day Mr. LuckyGuy's good hat gets blown away by a cheeky gust of wind and he gets lost when he follows it. So, he tries without success to get back to his lovely house, his garden, his life full of things, and along the way he notices something he had never noticed up till then: the people around him, who are precious not because they are made of gold but because they are what they are, they do what they do, because they are alive.

The author chooses irony as his style for this fine tale about wealth, both material and immaterial. The very same irony which this young and yet already established illustrator uses in her humorous drawings which are the ideal counterpoint for the sharp and witty text.





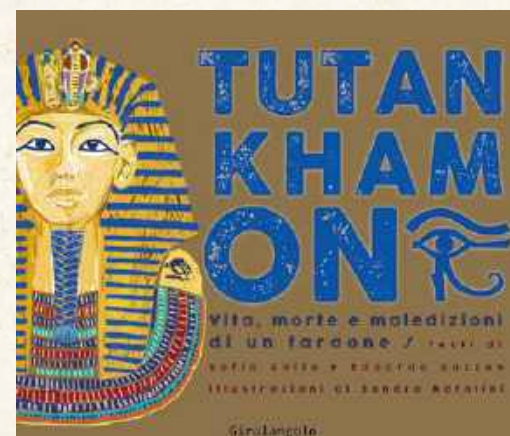

THOSE

THEM is a bright, amusing story which uses irony to tell a story of diffidence towards the Stranger, a universal theme which covers different times, cultures and places.

TUTANKHAMEN

The life, death and the curse of a pharaoh

The year 2022 was the hundredth anniversary of the discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamen.

The 20 interesting and precious objects found tell us in a playful way everything we know about the life, death and ups and downs of the great pharaoh. Children will be able to identify themselves with the great archaeologist who discovered Tutankhamen's tomb, Howard Carter. Just like or even better than Indiana Jones! On November 4th 1922, an incredible discovery revolutionized Egyptology: Howard Carter brought to light the tomb of the pharaoh Tutankhamen. From that day, the science that studies the world of the Ancient Egyptians couldn't go without admiring and examining closely every detail of the infinite series of wonders recovered in the four rooms composing the funeral monument. One hundred years on from that moment, Egyptologist Edoardo Guzzon and the writer Sofia Gallo bring children to those very rooms, and among those treasures, to find out about the life of a child like them...who became the pharaoh. Son of Akhenaten and Nefertiti, Tutankhamen was only nine years old when his reign began. Anecdotes, information, documents and fascinating snippets lie thick on the ground in the pages of this manageable book, set out like a travel log, where readers are encouraged to assume the role of the great archaeologist Howard Carter and follow him, step by step, inside the tomb. A rapid, amusing and simple style is effectively supported by the graphics and Sandro Natalini's illustrations. A book which leaves room for creativity and imagination and which brings the reader closer to Ancient Egypt giving exhausting didactic notions.

A COMPOSED HEART: WHEN BREAKING A HEART IS NOT HEART-BREAKING

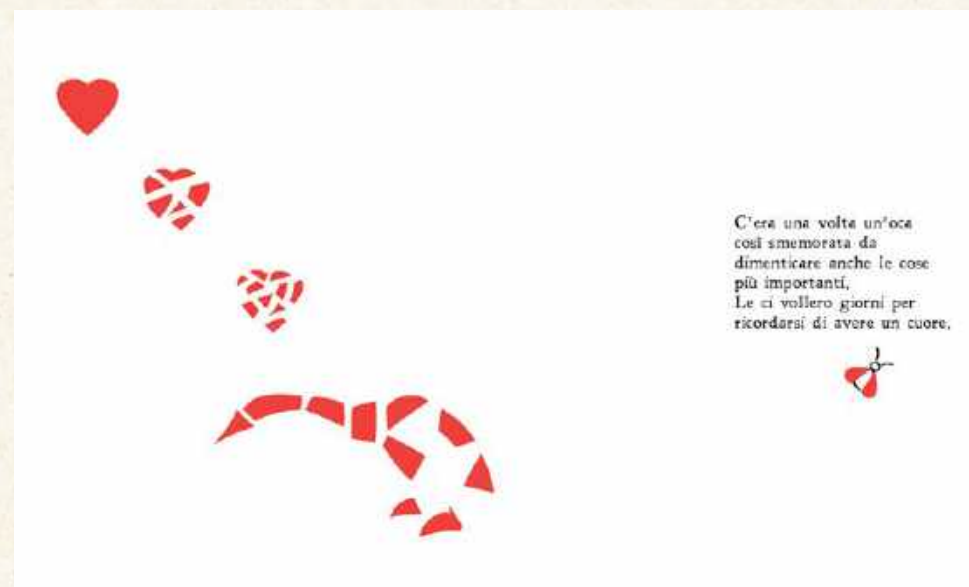
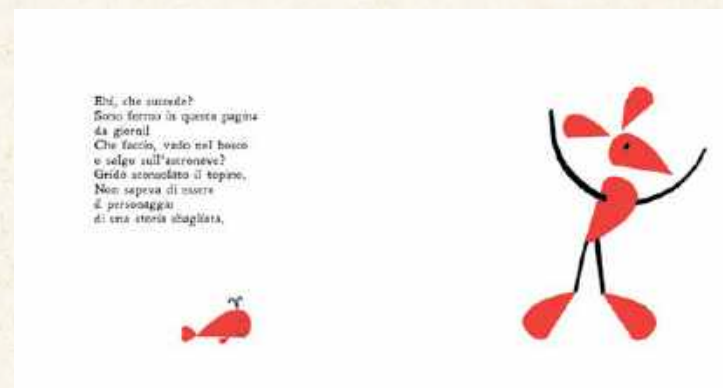
Play-book for children and adults who say: I can't think of anything, I'm not able to, I can't draw.

Creativity is considered to be one of the highest attainments of human intellect. Creativity in children can be developed by engaging them in activities that enable them share their ideas, thoughts and feelings and by exposing them to a variety of materials that can be manipulated and combined.

The process of disordering or de-structuring of the patterns followed by a new ordering or restructuration is a manifestation of the creative imagination and helps at a higher level for the emergence of a transformation for continued growth. Transformation is a process by which things become connected with each other and operate at high level of organisation and complexity: the known structure is pulled apart, or de-structured into its primary elements, for the restructuring of something new. Moreover, the processes of construction, deconstruction and reconstruction is an approach to understanding the relationships.

This book, born from direct experience in workshops, plays around trying to light sparks of imagination in children and adults, allowing the hands to trigger the imagination (thinking with one's hands).

The heart shape bear strongly symbolic meanings: love, friendship, cohesion, compassion and understanding, femininity, attraction, mirroring. It is the symbol of physical and spiritual being, and represents the central wisdom of feeling as opposed to the head-wisdom of reason. It carries connotations of the soul, along with strength and courage.



Here, hearts can be manipulated, joined, combined, separated, shaped and details can be added in pencil on a sheet of paper for the composition of fascinating drawings collages.

Let's read the author's words:

Here, hearts can multiply, turn, flip over, line up, be made larger or smaller. I love cutting them and change them into something else. Who are they? What language do they speak? Where are they going? What do they smell of? Each question opens the door to fantasy. Magic is made.

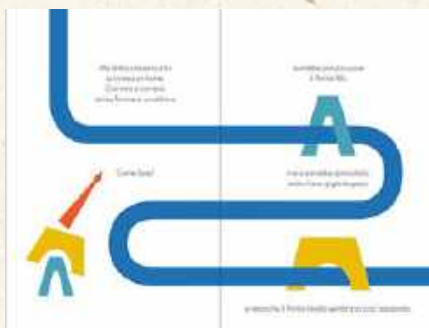
THE GIANT ARRIVES IN PARIS

BEYOND

If I were at the top of a tree, what would I see? If I were that cyclist going past what would I see? If I were the painter of that picture, what would I see? An infinite number of questions and points of view are intertwined, make us forget our own point of view and allow us to travel with our mind.

The role of Imagination is central in early childhood education. Creative play is the playful manipulation of emotions and ideas. It helps children to learn the ability to act out stories that involve different perspectives. It develops critical thinking skills and creative problem-solving abilities, important goals for cognitive and social development.

In this book, it is asked to children to recover an image through memory and imagination, training his/her ability to imagine what they cannot see with their own eyes, going further where lies a system too vast and complex to appear before the eye. It is a book that invites children to imagine there is something where there is no image; it invites children to go against experiential judgment, and act upon imagination.

A case-bound album which explores themes like adventure, discovery, diversity, welcoming attitudes, nonconformity. In the blùe wolves town live the blùe wolves that lead a repetitive and dull life: the only weird thing is that they are so blue that you need to put an accent on the 'u' to talk about all that existing blue. One day their boring life is turned upside down by the arrival of a red wolf that is so red that you need three Rs to talk about all that red. The rrred wolf can whistle, a skill unknown to the blùe ones, and by repeatedly doing so he eventually brings to town cheerfulness, mess and the awareness that there are many things to find out and learn about. So, when the rrred wolf suddenly goes away, the blùe wolves have learnt something new. No wonder then that the yellow wolf arriving in town one fine day will not be welcomed with distrust anymore; on the contrary he will be taken as a new opportunity.

AMALI AND THE TREE

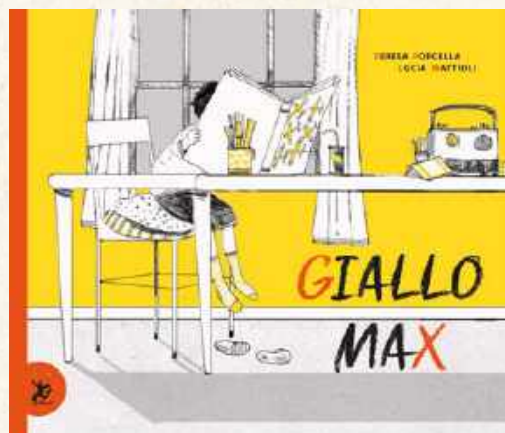

One day, the girl goes with him to visit the Lady of the Stone House, a healer whose methods border on magic. When the latter scratches her by mistake with a pair of scissors, something inside her opens; every time she scratches herself, Maya can live in fables, legends and myths, witnessing them coming to life through the mouths or hands of their authors. Maya becomes particularly fond of one of them: Marie Cathernie D'Aulnoy, born in that same village and author of Fairy Tales. Meeting Marie is a totalizing experience for Marie: she is not the typical dame of her era but a woman who has tried to redeem herself through her creativity. And Maya is ready to pay a price to meet her, the price of wounding herself to allow those stories to enter her.

Following the steps of this courageous protagonist and her mentor, we witness the birth of a narrator: in this fantastic (no, fabulous) training course, Maya discovers the tool which will allow her to find something magical even in the real world, narration. And thanks to it, she decides to dedicate herself to the cure of that open wound which is, for her and for everyone, life.

THE MISSING NOTE

blown up by a mine; it is a little bruised but still working, and it is dragged by her down to the bottom of the hill. The girl would rather not take it home as she fears the reaction of the two sisters with whom she lives. But finally, they agree to keep it, because it can help them and even help the whole village. Marisa's parents are dead, the country is at war, many people of the village take part in the Resistance. In this little mountain village in the middle of nowhere anything new is an amusement, even more if it brings joy and music with it. When Marisa opens the case and touches the keys, the small community gathers around it. The organ is the narrating voice of this unusual novel, it tells us what it sees, the stories of the three girls who have welcomed it. It tells the story of Marisa's obstinacy in trying to repair the damage done by the accident: a missing note. But to find a suitable key and a reed, the only solution seems to be an abandoned shrine, a few days' walk away.

Simone Saccucci works with children and young people in difficult situations, and with universities through seminars and workshops for future educators and teachers. A young author who is also a minstrel, the heir to a long-lasting oral tradition which comes to life again today in shows for and with children and youngsters who often have a difficult background.

SIMONE SACCUCCI, born in 1979, has been a community storyteller for around twenty years. He works with words, music and song, especially in the suburbs (from Naples to Sheffield, from Rome to Edinburgh). He is a teacher, social worker, storyteller. He has been involved in education for around 20 years with particular interest in stories and in memory which he uses to involve people and to create moments of participation.

He worked with Ascanio Celestini in 2006, then with Erri De Luca, and then with groups such as the English Folk Dance and Song Society; The Maxxi Museum in Rome, Roma Tre University, the University of Cagliari. And just as the rapidly changing weather makes the lake dangerous, this story clouds over in a second, when, while playing truant from school, a boat trip turns into a nightmare and a boy, Tiziano, is knifed. Ali, his schoolmate, is accused of assault and at the same time he is on the run from the real culprits. With the help of a group of local youngsters, The Courage Band, Monica sets to work to solve the mystery. And in rapid succession right up to the last page of buck-passing, discoveries, betrayals, intimidations and subterfuge, the youngsters manage to see clearly enough to accuse the real thugs and unveil – although at a high price – at least a slice of truth.

Tense and passionate until the liberating ending, the story stirs the reader's curiosity over a faraway place and teenagers that live and grow up, in those so difficult lands, like every other adolescent in the world.

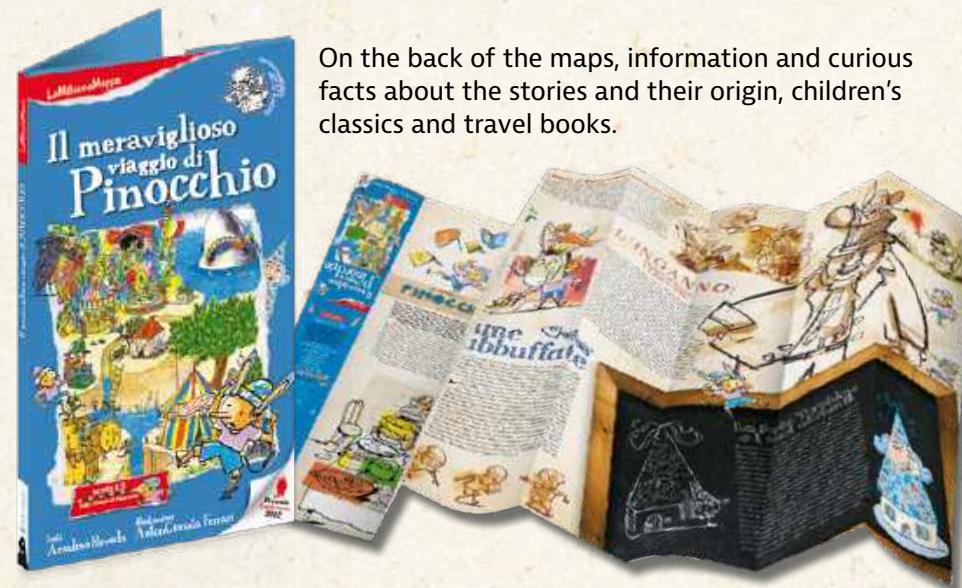

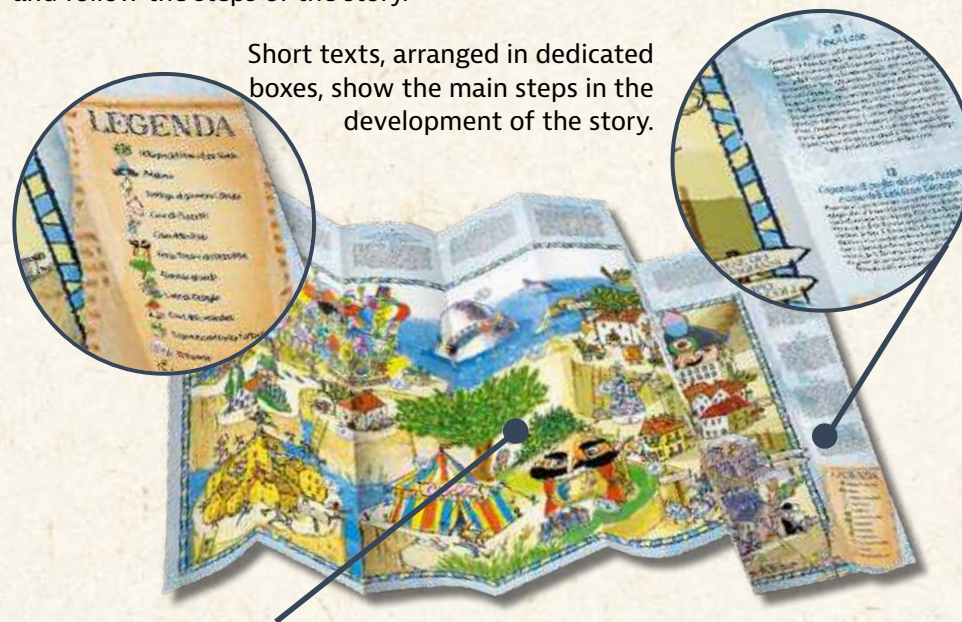

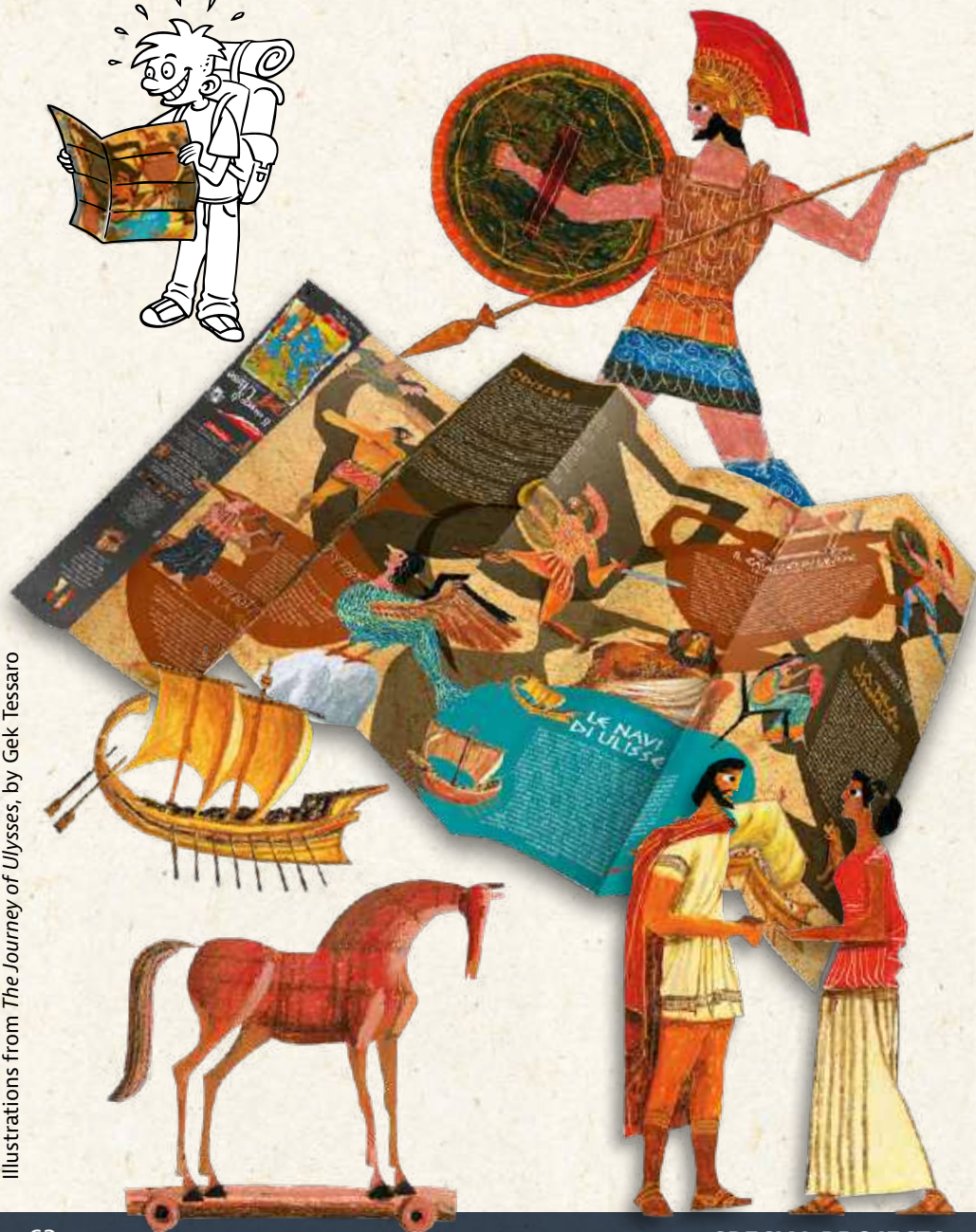
