






Ib the Dog


So begins every story about the incredibly charming, helpful and a bit cheeky dog lb, who reminds us of a curious and over-confident preschooler.

Ib is, in the typically Scandinavian children's book tradition, a "competent child": independent, curious, imaginative, and has an unusual and playful way of problem solving, which allows him to see things from a slightly different point of view to the adults and other animals around him.

Ib the Dog is a TV and book series aimed at preschoolers, and their adults. The appealing illustrations and main characters are easy to recognize for the youngest; the stories are set in a familiar world, but all have a twist that makes them feel unique.





Mimi Åkesson has studied Creative Writing in Stockholm and has worked as an editor. She has contributed to journals and anthologies such as *20-TAL*, *Ordkonst*, and *Blå blixt*.

Linda Bondestam is an award-winning Finland-Swedish artist, illustrator, and children's book author. She has illustrated around 30 picture books. In 2024, she was awarded the August Prize in the children and youth category for the book *Chop Chop*.


Everyone runs back outside. I walk slowly, dragging my feet.

He doesn't think so. He runs straight to the slide.


A book about those boring days when nothing feels right, when we don't feel like doing anything — until something small (really small) changes everything. We all have days like this.


Who wants to help preparing all the recipes?





They're Called Adults



She spent her days exploring the countryside around her family's summer house, wandering through fields, enjoying the scents of wildflowers, and quietly caring for animals on her own.


Then, one day, her baby brother was born.





A silent book with a single, powerful cry: Peace!

Like the storks returning each year to their old nests, Margaryta Wikler longs for a home where peace awaits. A debut work by a promising young talent which speaks to us all.

A flock takes flight, heading home. The first land a stork sees is Cape Kinburn, a sandbar on the Black Sea. Each spring, she returns to her nest to lay eggs and raise her young. But Ukraine, once her green haven, is scarred by war. Explosions and fires darken the skies. The stork rests where she can, even as floodwaters from the destroyed Kakhovka Dam swallow villages, even as mined fields and ruined cities stretch below. Her nest is gone, yet she keeps flying.

And like the stork, the Ukrainian people won't give up.

"I love to capture fleeting, silent moments of beauty," says Margaryta Winkler, a Ukrainian illustrator and graphic designer now studying at the Rhode Island School of Design on a Fulbright scholarship. Forced to flee her war-torn country after February 2022, she found herself far from home, yet morally bound to those still resisting. This book is her heartfelt tribute to her land, her people, and the hope of peace.

Days is a lyrical and visually stunning picture book that captures the emotional rhythm of everyday life - the quiet, the chaotic, the magical, and the mysterious.



Together with the horse Rosendelid, she sails on a ghost ship across the Sea of Glass to embark on the adventure of a lifetime.

Karin Boye was born in 1900, and is one of the greatest poets the Nordic countries have ever known. The story draws inspiration from her life and poetic world.

Kristina Sigunsdotter is a Swedish journalist, author and playwright, writing for children, young adults as well as poetry and lyrics. Together with Ester Eriksson she won the August Prize in 2020 for *The Secrets of Cricket Karlsson*. Her play *Systrana Stormhatt och det Stora Fågeläventyret* has been performed both at the Royal Dramatic Theatre in Stockholm and the Stockholm City Theatre. She is the founder of The Poetry Factory, a poetry workshop for children.

Jenny Lucander is a Finland-Swedish picture book artist and illustrator based in Helsinki. She has illustrated several acclaimed children's books, including *Vi är lajon!* (We Are Lions!), which won the Nordic Council Children and Young People's Literature Prize in 2020. Her work has previously been nominated for the same prize twice, as well as for the Runeberg Junior Prize, the Elsa Beskow Plaque, and the Rudolf Koivu Prize. Jenny Lucander has also been nominated for the Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award (ALMA) in recent years.

With humor and skill, Marina Montero shows how classical mechanics appears in everyday life. Using playful examples, she brings physics out of textbooks and into the real world.


After reading Mechanics Illustrated, you'll see every step you take as part of a physics lesson.







Cartoonist and science communicator Sara Filippi Plotegher explores the roles, needs, and importance of trees in our cities. She shows how humans and plants can live together in a more balanced and supportive way.

Did you know about mycorrhizae, root fungi that form networks connecting trees so they can share resources and help each other? This is why planting trees alone often fails. Or that asphalt prevents soil from breathing and absorbing water? Using permeable materials, raised pavements, or upstream green spaces can solve this. And if you fear a tree might fall on your house, remember that bad pruning is often the bigger danger.

Living in harmony with plants is possible if we listen, understand, and show respect.

And they are just as necessary today.

Stefan Einhorn is a professor, oncologist, and chair at the Centre for Social Sustainability, Karolinska Institutet. He is a bestselling author of books on ethics, kindness, and human behavior.

Liv Svirsky is a psychologist and CBT psychotherapist. She specializes in child and adolescent psychology and is the author of several books and cohost of the podcast Barnpsykologerna (The Child Psychologists).
