

The author is building the NASA Lunar Lander!




DIVORCE

A kid-centric guide for the children of parents going through a divorce or separation, written by internationally renowned divorce therapist Kate Scharff.




A Sick History Of MEDICINE




QUEENS OF THE JUNGLE






THE MUSEUM

Robots


The future is here. Explore the world of robots and artificial intelligence in this STEM book by robotics professor Henny Admoni.


Grimes, this illustrated book explains what robots are, how they are made, and how we can use them in all sorts of amazing ways – from driverless cars to robots helping in hospitals.



TALES OF ANCIENT EGYPT


Everyone knows the story of Tutankhamun, but the ancient Egyptian civilization lasted for more than 3,000 years – which means there are loads more amazing tales to be told!






A DAY IN


In this critically acclaimed narrative series kids will get to spend 24 hours with their favourite animals.

























Secrets of the Ocean






In the ongoing fight against climate change, plastic pollution, and diseases, scientists are turning to an unlikely ally – plants!




REWILDING


Rewilding means returning animals or plants to places where they used to live. In this book, acclaimed biologist David A. Steen introduces some of the most amazing conservation stories from around the world.


Heard about the fish that clean shark teeth?
