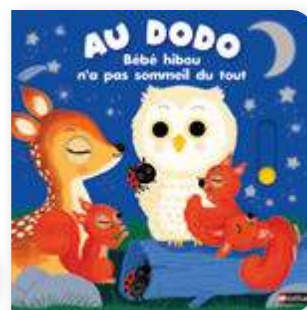
Nighty-Night Time By Charlotte Roederer

Germaine Cellier, “chemist of beauty”, the first woman “nose” in France.

Germaine Cellier (1909–1976) is the creator of some among the most famous fragrances sold by famous Maisons (Robert Piguet, Balmain, Nina Ricci, Balenciaga) but she has largely remained unknown. In a very masculine environment, Germaine Cellier managed to find her place as female “nose”, thanks to her explosive and provocative creations. Germaine Cellier's perfumes have seduced both sides of the Atlantic, and are still today the choice of the likes of Sofia Coppola and Courtney Love.

Since a very young age, young Germaine started discovering the world through a very developed sense of smell. At 12, during a walk, she finds a sand pink carnation and exclaims: “I love this! It's... biting! Peppery!”. At 15 she announces to her parents, strong willed: “What I would really like, is to create perfumes!” She enrolls in the Scientia school, in Auteil, and obtains a diploma of assistant chemist. Intuition, visionary and audacious, she soon starts creating her own fragrances, a small revolution in the universe of French parfumerie.



The script writer:

Béatrice Egémar is the author of about thirty children's books, witnessing her eclectic tastes: little tales for very young readers, historical detective novels for teenagers, a trilogy devoted to the history of parfumerie, a picture book on Egyptian mythology, an A to Z of rock n' roll...

Painter, illustrator, NFT creator, she works for the press and exhibits her paintings between Paris and Bordeaux, but remains faithful to her first love, Comics. She studied Fine Arts in Bordeaux in the 90s, published her first book in 1996 and never stopped. She has created over twenty comics, children's books, fiction, biographies and documentaries, always exploring new horizons, and she is never bored.
