Her debut adult fiction novel, *The Faster I Walk, the Smaller I Am*, was shortlisted for the International IMPAC Dublin Literary Award and published in 29 territories. A versatile and prodigious writer, Skomsvold writes children's books, fiction and poetry.

Mari Kanstad Johnsen (b. 1981) is an internationally awarded and acclaimed artist, children's book author and illustrator. In 2012, her illustrations in a picture book was on the American magazine Flavorwire's list "The 20 Most Beautiful Children's Books of All Time". In 2017 she was honored "special mention" at the international Bologna Ragazzi Awards. She is a nominee for the 2025 ALMA – the Astrid Lindgren Memorial Award. Kanstad Johnsen has illustrated for several newspapers and magazines, including New York Times. She has a degree from Oslo National Academy of the Arts and Konstfack, University of Arts, Crafts and Design in Stockholm.

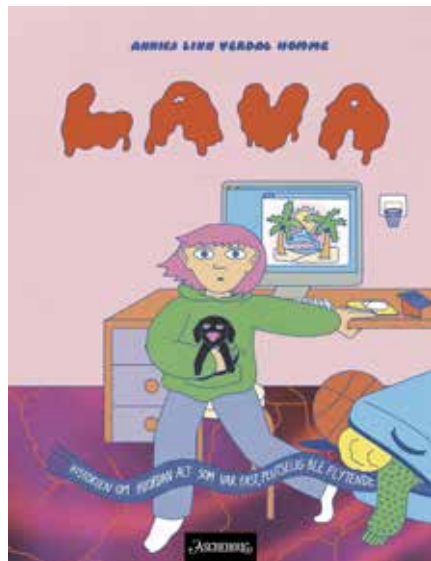
Nora Dåsnes (b. 1995) is an awarded and highly acclaimed author and illustrator of graphic novels. She received the prestigious 2022 Nordic Council Literary Prize for *Missed Calls*. For her debut, *Cross My Heart and Never Lie*, she has earned international awards and nominations, among them the Stonewall Book Award (U.S.). For *Save Our Forest!* she won the Prix UNICEF de littérature jeunesse (France).

In 2025, Dåsnes was named one of Norway's 10 best younger writers, in a prestigious list published every ten years in a cooperation between the cultural weekly Morgenbladet and Lillehammer Literary Festival. The list showcases 10 writers under 35 who are considered the most promising literary talents of their generation.

Nora Dåsnes has a degree in illustration and animation from Kingston University, London.

Divorce hits differently for everyone. Sometimes it looks like this: parents who are idiots, coaches who disappoint, and friends who just don't get it. Evi refuses to play along, and there are consequences. Because really, should a child be expected to carry the weight of their own life, and a puppy, while the parents are trying to figure out their lives?

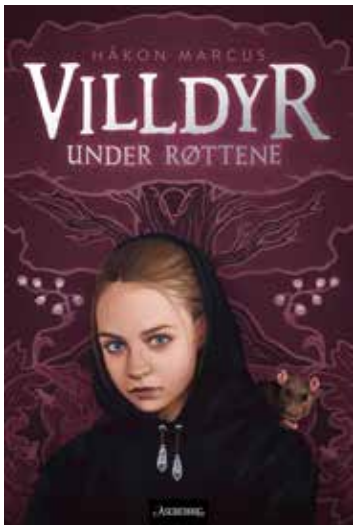

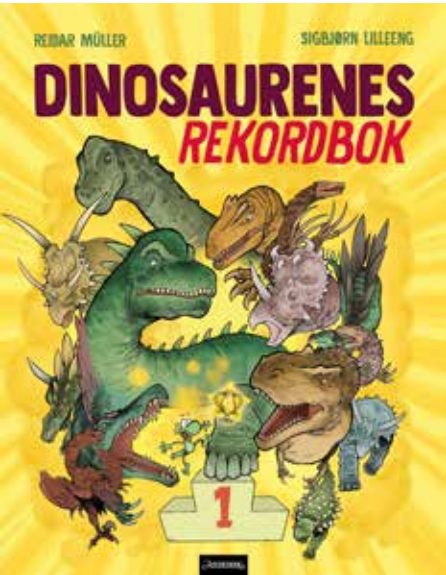

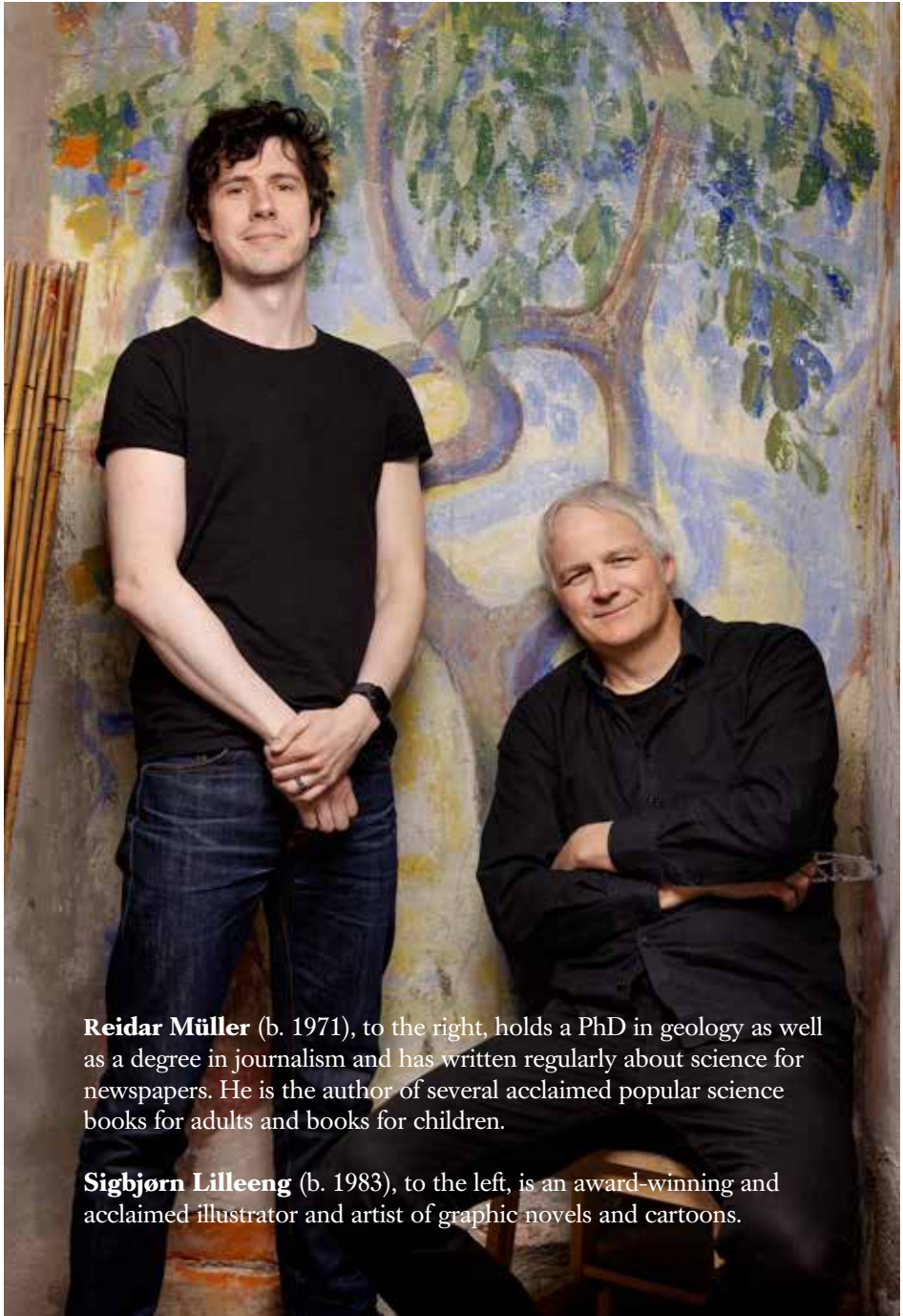
